


## ARTificial Reality: *Paint Park* with Alison Goodyear

Throughout February 2020, MK Gallery's Project Space will host *Paint Park* - a dynamic installation created by artist, Alison Goodyear, which explores the possibilities of 'phygital' painting, where digital and physical painting intersect. Pupils will take part in a unique, inspiring three-part experience focussing on the physical and digital possibilities of paint:

### **Paint Park**

Pupils will work with Alison Goodyear to explore, analyse and discuss the expanded field of painting. Alongside an artist's talk with Q+A and a short film about the making of the works, pupils will don VR headsets and plunge into a fantastical realm of VR painting. ### **MK Calling 2020**

Pupils will join one of our Learning Scouts on a tour of *MK Calling 2020*, MK Gallery's open call group exhibition showcasing, amongst other art forms, the most dynamic painting being made today.
